Ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls, this is the Arnhem Trumpeter Corps from Holland.

Besides the gala show, called 'Made in Holland', the band has a second show called 'All Hands on Deck'. It's more nonsensical, not too serious and winks at the old movie 'All Hands on Deck' with Pat Boone, where a couple of sailors go to the local bar and have a great time, but also have to return to their barracks. The show also winks at a part of Dutch history, because drum major Berry Stinnissen plays the part of the very famous Piet Hein, especially for today.

Piet Hein lived from 1577 until 1629 and was a Dutch naval officer and folk hero during the Eighty Years' War between the United Provinces and Spain.

In 1623, he became vice-admiral of the new Dutch West India Company (WIC). But, he was also known a bit as a pirate, because in 1627 he attacked and captured over thirty richly laden Portuguese merchant ships and a year later he sailed out to capture a Spanish treasure fleet loaded with silver from their American colonies.

But now for Piet the time has come to have some fun ashore, make some music with his sailor corps and entertain the visitors with his tattoo.

The songs that you will hear are:

- The Little Cafe By The Harbour, (a Dutch song but also sung by Engelbert Humperdinck )
- Yellow submarine, by the Beatles,
- In the Navy, by the Village people,
- What shall we do with a drunken sailor,
- And many typical Dutch songs like: 'a little journey along the river Rhine', and 'My lovely house-boat at the Amsterdam Canals',
